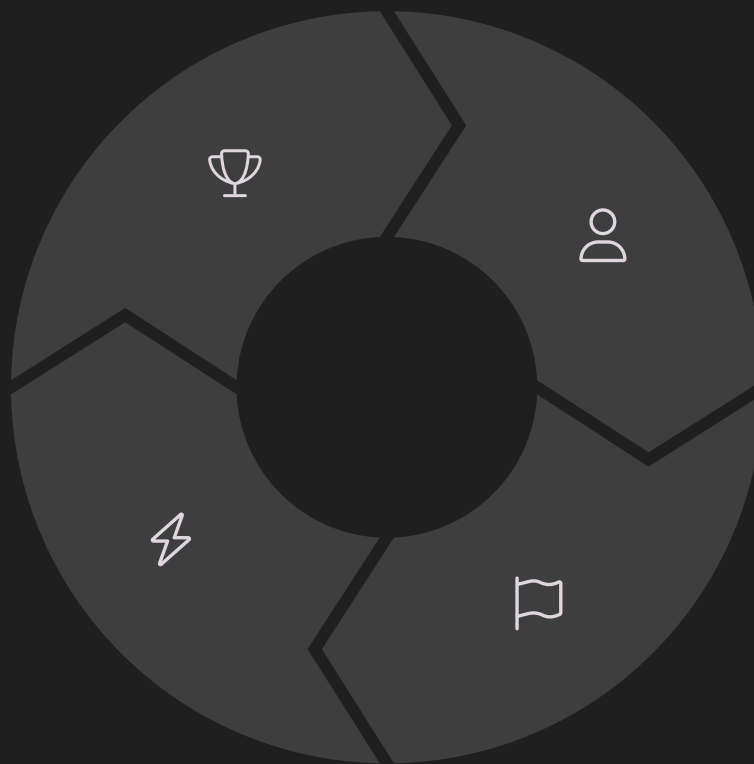
1988 World Championships

Lost 1989 Soviet Nationals title to Alexander Fadeev. The defeat tested his resilience during a critical career phase.

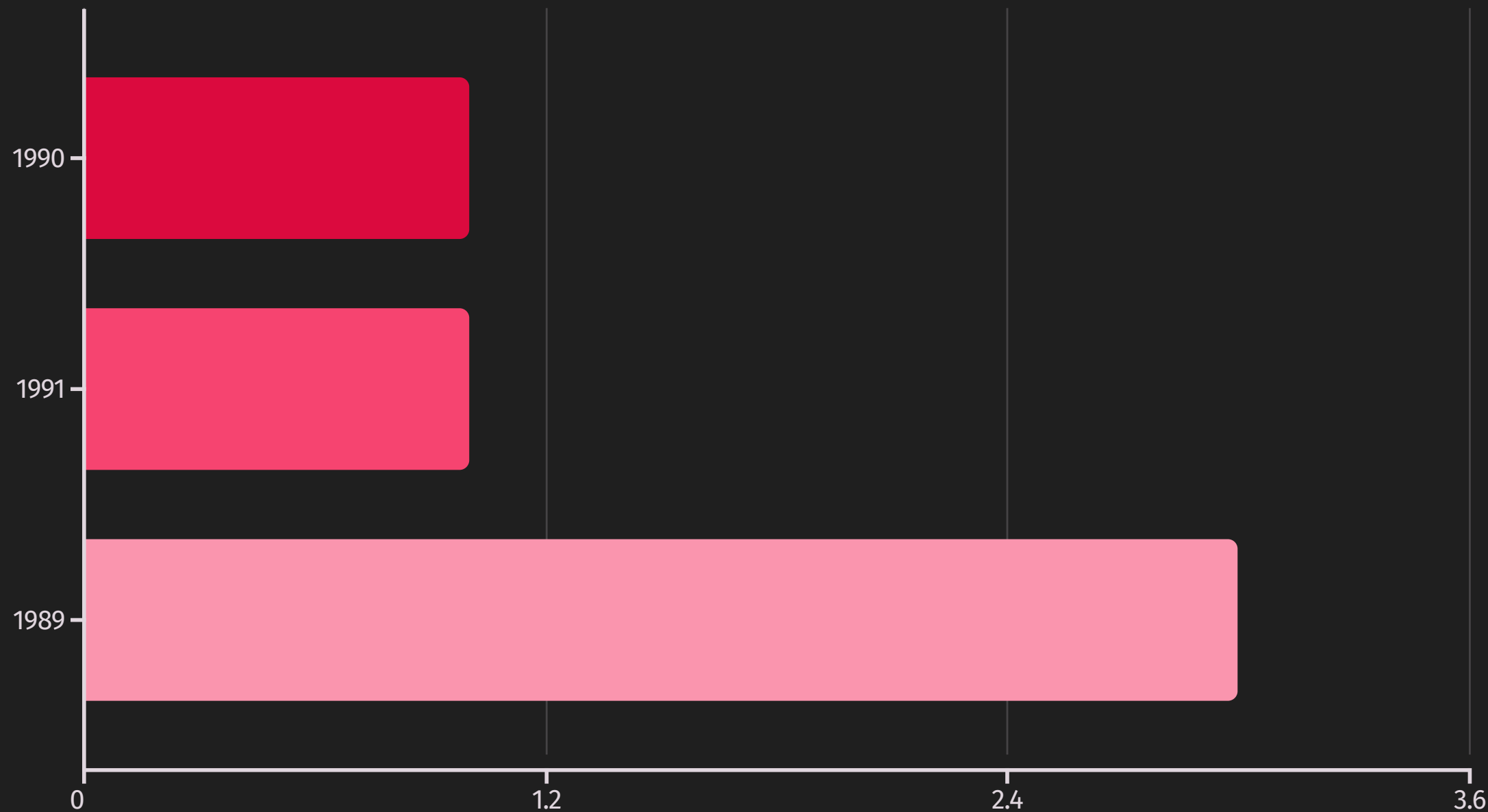
World Championship Struggle

Won 1994 European Championship for independent Ukraine.



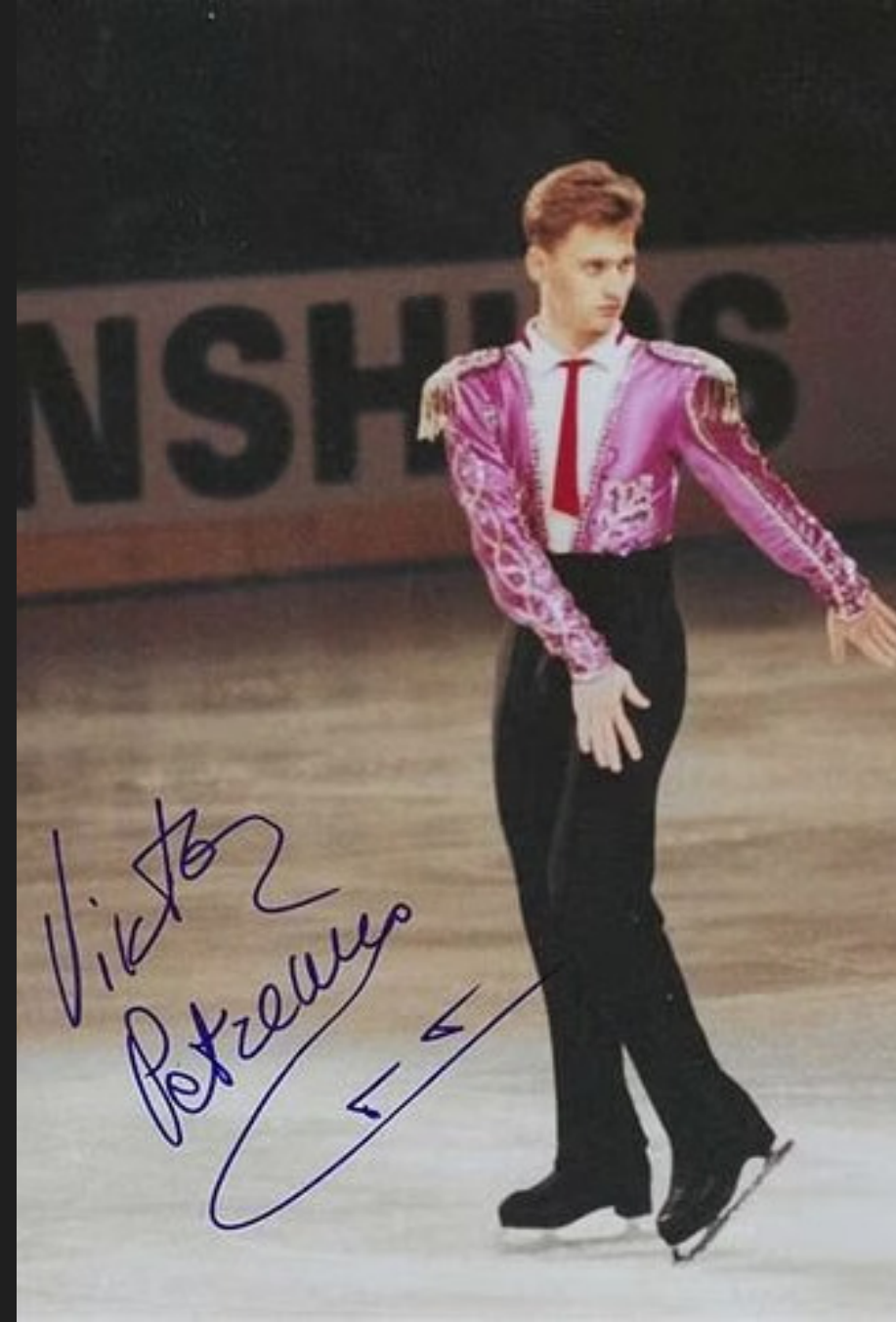
Lillehammer Olympics
